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

Autograph quotation signed, dated *Wien d. 18. Dezember 1923* by the German conductor at the Vienna State Opera from 1920 to 1938 before moving to America. Alwin quotes Franz Schubert's lied "An die Musik" (1817), with text from the poem of Franz von Schober 1 p. (12 x 9 cm).




2. Marie-Thérèse Amirian-Josset (1879-1948)

**3. Paul Angerer** (Vienna, 1927 - 2017)

Photographic portrait with autograph signature of the Austrian violist and composer. He began writing music in 1947. His many compositions are influenced by the works of Paul Hindemith. He wrote oratorios, a musical, theatre music for the Salzburg and Bregenz Festivals, orchestral works, including many concertos for different instruments, vocal, choral and keyboard music, and a large number of chamber and instrumental works. He received the 1953 Austrian State Prize for Music for his *Musik für Viola allein.* (10 x 14 cm). € 60





**4. Michael William Balfe** (Dublin, 1808 - Ware, 1870)

*Francesco Maria Piave - Pittore e Duca*

Rare autograph letter signed in Italian, dated Trieste Nov 28. 1854 by the Irish composer, baritone and conductor. Balfe addresses a gentleman, asking for money: "...Ho aspettato sino ad ora per una lettera da Ricordi e non sento parlare di lui, cosa vuol dire ciò? Io l'ho scritto pregandolo di non mancare di pagare mille lire ... al padrone della Bella Venezia per me perché l'ultimo di questo mese scade una cambiale da me firmata in favore di Ronzano, che sarà presentata a quell'albergo...". He then mentions his opera "Pittore e Duca" performed in Trieste: "...[Francesco Maria] Piave vi avrà scritto l'esito di "Pittore e Duca" qui, ma non abbiate paura per questa, i greci erano determinati di fare un dispiacere ad un inglese, e se l'opera fosse stata composta da un angelo sceso dal cielo l'esito sarebbe stato lo stesso...". 4 pp. In-8.




**5. Alexandre Batta** (Maastricht, 1816 - Versailles, 1902)




Lot of four autograph letters signed (one by the hand of his wife Alice Olivier (1827-1925), dated in Geneva and Dardagny between 1870 and 1875 by the famous Swiss pianist, who went to Paris in 1835, where he studied with Frédéric Chopin and met Franz Liszt who was particularly supportive and helped publish Bovy-Lysberg's *Les Suisses*, op. 1, a set of waltzes for piano. On music matters. We report an extract as a sample: "...Je viens de suite vous demander si cela vous conviendrait de faire avec moi un contrat pour deux ou trois années, selon votre désir. 


## 9. Alfred Bruneau (Paris, 1857 - ib., 1934)

Émile Zola - Le Rêve

Very fine autograph letter about Emile Zola, signed, dated 27 Décembre 1890 by the French composer and conductor. To a colleague: "...j'ai maintenant grand hâte de vous faire connaître ma partition. Votre critique sincère me sera particulièrement précieuse, car je vous sais très attiré vers la musique moderne et la lecture de vos feuillets me montre que notre tentative vous intéresse (...) Comme vous le supposéz, la chute du théâtre lyrique m'a causée quelque ennui, car les répétitions étaient déjà fort avancées. Dès que l'ouvrage a été libre, M. Duquesnel, directeur de la Porte St. Martin est entré en pourparler avec nous les représentations du Rêve. Mais la chose est assez difficile à mettre sur pied dans un théâtre jusqu'à présent uniquement consacré au drame et où, pour faire de la musique, il faut engager une troupe spéciale, un orchestre, des choeurs... M. Zola, dont vous connaissez la grande bonté et le simple dévouement". **Zola offered** to the young composer a libretto he was still writing but would not complete for several months - **Le Rêve**. Bruneau was delighted, but informed him of his disastrous first attempt at opera, Kérim 2 pp. 1/2. In-8.

**10. Henri Büsser** (Toulouse, 1872 - Paris, 1973)

*Debussy*

Lot of six autograph letters signed, dated between 1897 and 1923 by the French composer, organist and conductor. His orchestration and harmony were influenced by Debussy, with whom his name remains closely associated: Büsser conducted ten performances of *Pelléas et Mélisande* in 1902, and orchestrated his *Petite Suite* and *Printemps*. These Büsser's letters are addressed to the composer **Delphin Balleyguier** (1829-1899), to **Geneviève Blanchard** and to **Jeanne Telen** and concern, among others things, Büsser's recommendation as organist of S. **17. Eduard de Hartog** (Amsterdam, 1825 - The Hague, 1909)


Two autograph letters signed by the Dutch conductor and composer. He was active as a pianist and a pedagogue (1852–1900). He composed the operas *Le Manage de Don Lope* (Paris, 1865) and *L'Amour et son Hôte* (Brussels, 1873), 3 symphonic poems, a set of orchestral sketches, chamber music, and piano pieces. He was a friend of the composer Valentin Alkan who dedicated one of his compositions to him. **A.** Amsterdam 21 Novembre 1855. To a gentleman, concerning his opus 52 "Pensée de minuit": "... **18. Frederic Hymen Cowen** (Kingston JM, 1853 - London, 1935)

Two fine autograph letters signed, not dated, by the English celebrated composer and conductor. Cowen addresses the music critic Aldo Noseda, thanking him for articles he wrote on him. For a total of 2 pp. In-8. **Included:** autograph letter signed on card, not dated, addressed to Aldo Noseda: "...I wanted to tell you that Sanzogno has taken my opera 'Signa' and will perform it as soon as he can...". *Signa* is an opera originally conceived in four acts with music by the British composer with a libretto by Gilbert Arthur à Beckett, after Ouida, with an Italian translation by Giannandrea Mazzucato, first performed in a reduced three-act version at the Teatro Dal Verme, Milan on 12 November 1893. **19. Antoine Elwart** (Paris, 1808 - ib., 1877)

*Grand prix de Rome 1834*

Lot of four autograph letters signed by the French composer and musicologist, prix de Rome in 1834 and professor at the Conservatoire. Already known to the Parisian public, he played in France his compositions that he sent from Rome. He produced a *Deuxième messe solennelle* in 1835 dedicated to the Duchess of Orleans, an Italian opera and the funeral *Omaggio alla memoria di Vincenzo Bellini* (November 1835, Teatro Valle, Rome) in hommage to the famous opera composer who died shortly before. Letters are dated between 1839 and 1859 and are addressed to music related people such as Alfred de Beauchesne (1803-1876), secretary at the Conservatoire and the music critic Alexis Azevedo (1813-1875), concerning music performances programs, a 1844 performance of Halevy's *La Juive* and other. 

**20. Camille Erlanger** (Paris, 1863 - ib., 1919)

Pierre Louÿs

**21. Michael Field (1915-1971) Vera Appleton (1918 - m.),**

*Pianist and then famous chef*

Original photograph with signed autograph dedication of the acclaimed piano duo sitting at a piano. The duo formed by the Juilliard classmates was well appreciated during the 1950s. (8 x 10 inch.) Photograph by "Bruno of Hollywood". Field, who in his maturity became one of the most famous cooking experts, was born in New York City. His mother died when he was three years old, and he was raised by William Calhoun, a piano teacher, and his wife. Field said that the latter "got him interested in cooking". Field was educated in New York, first at the George Washington High School and then, on a scholarship, at the Juilliard School of Music. In 1943, Field formed a piano duo with Vera Appleton. They gave their first concert in December and, over the following 21 years, they gave numerous performances in the US and abroad. Their repertoire included the classics and premieres of new works. Their recordings range from 18th-century music, by composers such as Bach and Mozart, to 20th century works by Stravinsky, as well as popular arrangements of pieces by Johann Strauss.






**24. Magdeleine Godard** (1860-1940)

Autograph dedication signed, dated *Dimanche* by the French violinist. In 1875 she first appeared on stage with his brother Benjamin, a composer and violinist. After Benjamin's death in 1895, Magdeleine devoted herself to promoting and performing his music. Magdeleine Godard was a friend of Jules Massenet, Charles Gounod, and Camille Saint-Saëns with whom she corresponded extensively. 1 p. (12 x 10 cm).



**25. Gabriel Grovlez** (Lille, 1879 - Paris, 1944)



**26. Clémence de Grandval** (Saint-Rémy-des-Monts, 1828 - Paris, 1907)

Three autograph letters signed, not dated [1880 ca.], by the French composer and singer, pupil of Friedrich von Flotow, Camille Saint-Saëns and Frédéric Chopin. De Grandval addresses the harpist **Coraly Gatayes** (1840-1913), daughter of Léon. 






**30. Louis-Auguste-Florimond Ronger, dit Hervé** (Houdain, 1825 - Paris, 1892)




**31. Eugène Ketterer** (Rouen, 1831 - Paris, 1870)

*Transcriptions and fantasies on opera arias*

Lot of three autograph letters signed by the very prolific French pianist and composer. He appeared constantly as a pianist winning wide repute for his fantasies and drawing-room pieces, of which he wrote a large number, but only a few of which are still in the repertoire. He was foster brother of the archduchess Marie Antoinette, later the unfortunate queen of France, and entered the service of King Louis XVI of France as valet de chambre. Finally, he enjoyed an annual pension from Archduchess Marie-Christine and her husband, Prince Albert of Saxe-Teschen. He is the author of the work: 'Mémoires concernant Marie Antoinette archiduchesse d'Autriche, reine de France etc.'. 3 vols. (Londres 1804, 8°.). In a letter to Ludwig Joseph Max Fürsten von Starhemberg, dated 9 August 1809, 26 Hay-Market, in the possession of Count Andreas Thürheim, Weber expressly names himself as the author of these memoirs at the very beginning. I owe it to Count Thürheim's kindness that I was able to see a full copy of the letter. This document, in which Weber signs himself Pensionnaire de S. A. R. Mgr le duc Albert de Saxe-Teschen, begins with the words: 'J'ai l'honneur de présenter à votre Excellence le complètement du troisième et dernier volume de mes Mémoires...' and so on. The further content of this letter also leaves no room for doubt as to Weber's authorship of the cited memoirs. Now, however, this has been called into doubt, and this happened in the following way. These memoirs were published 18 years later in Paris - the first edition came out in 1822.






