



1. Heinrich Wilhelm Adalbert of Prussia (Berlin, 1811 - Karlsbad, 1873) Hohenzollern - German Navy Two autograph letters signed in German by the Admiral of the Prussian Navy in 1854. When, in the course of the war against Denmark, it became clear that Prussia's failure came from the sea, he became an ardent advocate of a war fleet. At his suggestion, Frederick William IV entrusted him with the construction of a port, which he had named Wilhelmshaven. From 1867, he was superior commander of the Imperial Navy. Both letters are addressed to a Consul and are dated 1854 and 1870, one of them concerning the "Télégraphie Nautique". For a total of 1 p. in-4. € 180





After graduating from Saint Cyr, he served as a second lieutenant in the 36th infantry regiment. In 1886, he had to give up his military career because of the new law prohibiting members of families that had ruled France from serving in the army. He turned to geography, geology and ethnography. A keen traveller, he devoted himself to botany, compiling the largest herbarium in the world. 

He refused to swear an oath to Louis-Philippe, and was involved in the Duchesse de Berry's attempt to overthrow the Vendée (1832). Sentenced to death in absentia, he went into exile and returned to France after the armistice of 1840. During the period of the Neapolitan Republic he was part of the first Company of the National Guard, as shown in the list of February 3, 1799, and held the position until the defense in one of the Castles of Naples. Following the capitulation treaty, he was among those who managed to escape the death sentence, exiled to Marseilles on August 30, 1799. In 1821, Di Fiore met the writer Stendhal in Paris, who was fourteen years his junior. Stendhal was fascinated by this fifty-something lawyer from Naples, sentenced to death and a political exile for the failed revolution of 1799. Stendhal was inspired by him to outline the figure of the Count of Altamira in his famous novel The Red and the Black. 35. Jean Ambroise Baston de Lariboisiere (Fougères, 1759 - Koenigsberg, 1812) Campaign in Russia One of the most famous artillery generals of the wars of the Revolution and the Empire. Lariboisiere was made Grand Officer of the Legion of Honor in June 1807, Count of the Empire in October 1808, and became the first Inspector General of the artillery in 1811. He took part in the Campaign in Russia in 1812, fighting at Smolensk on August 17 and Borodino on September 7. 54. Joseph Servan de Gerbey (Romans, 1741 - Paris, 1808)

French Revolution

Autograph letter signed, dated "Lyon, 31 aout 1791" by the French general. After the arrival of the Revolution, in 1790 Servan served at Marseille and then in November of 1791 he became a lieutenant colonel of the 61st Infantry. In March of 1792 Servan was promoted to colonel and only two months later he was again promoted, this time to maréchal de camp.
