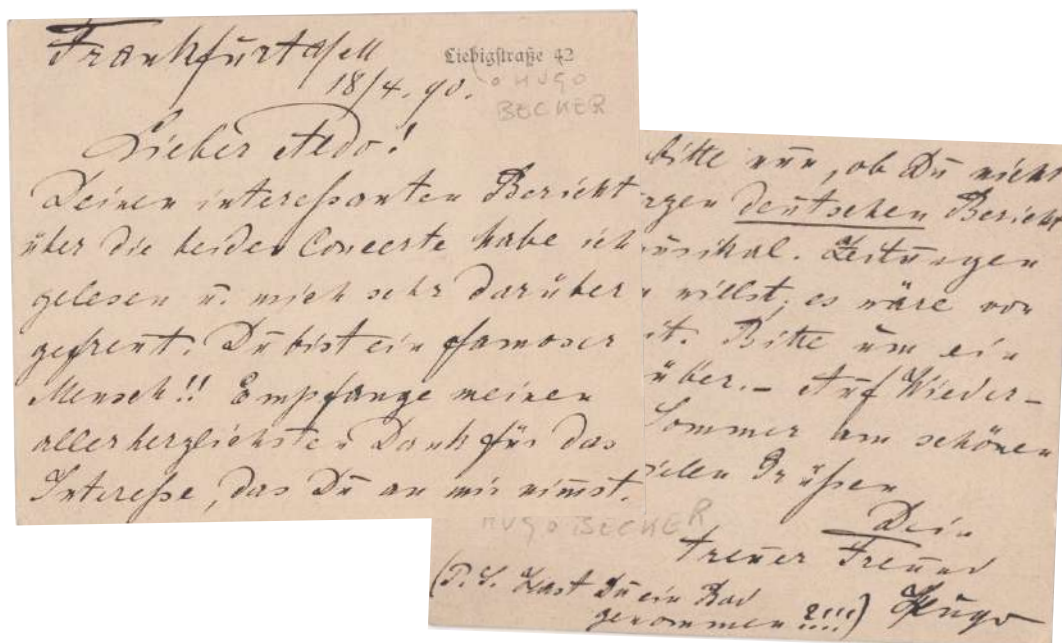


2. Hugo Becker (Strasbourg, 1863 - Grünwald, 1941)

Cello music

Autograph letter signed, dated "Frankfurt a/M 18/4. 90" by the German cellist and composer. He was pupil of Alfredo Piatti. Becker thanks his correspondent, presumably a journalist, for his article on his two concerts. 2 pp. On card.

3. Arrigo Boito (Padova, 1842 - Milan, 1918)

Scapigliatura

Autograph letter signed, dated Vodo di Cadore "11 sett. [1885]" by the Italian composer and librettist. Along with Emilio Praga and his brother Camillo Boito, he is regarded as one of the prominent representatives of the Italian bohemian artistic movement called "Scapigliatura". The ancestors of Silvestro, Arrigo and Camillo Boito came from Val Cadore. Addressed to Marina Consonni: "...Partirò di qua domani l'altro. Mi mandi le lettere a Venezia Albergo d'Italia. Sospenda l'invio del Corriere. Ó ricevuto la Nuova Antologia...". 1 p. On postcard.

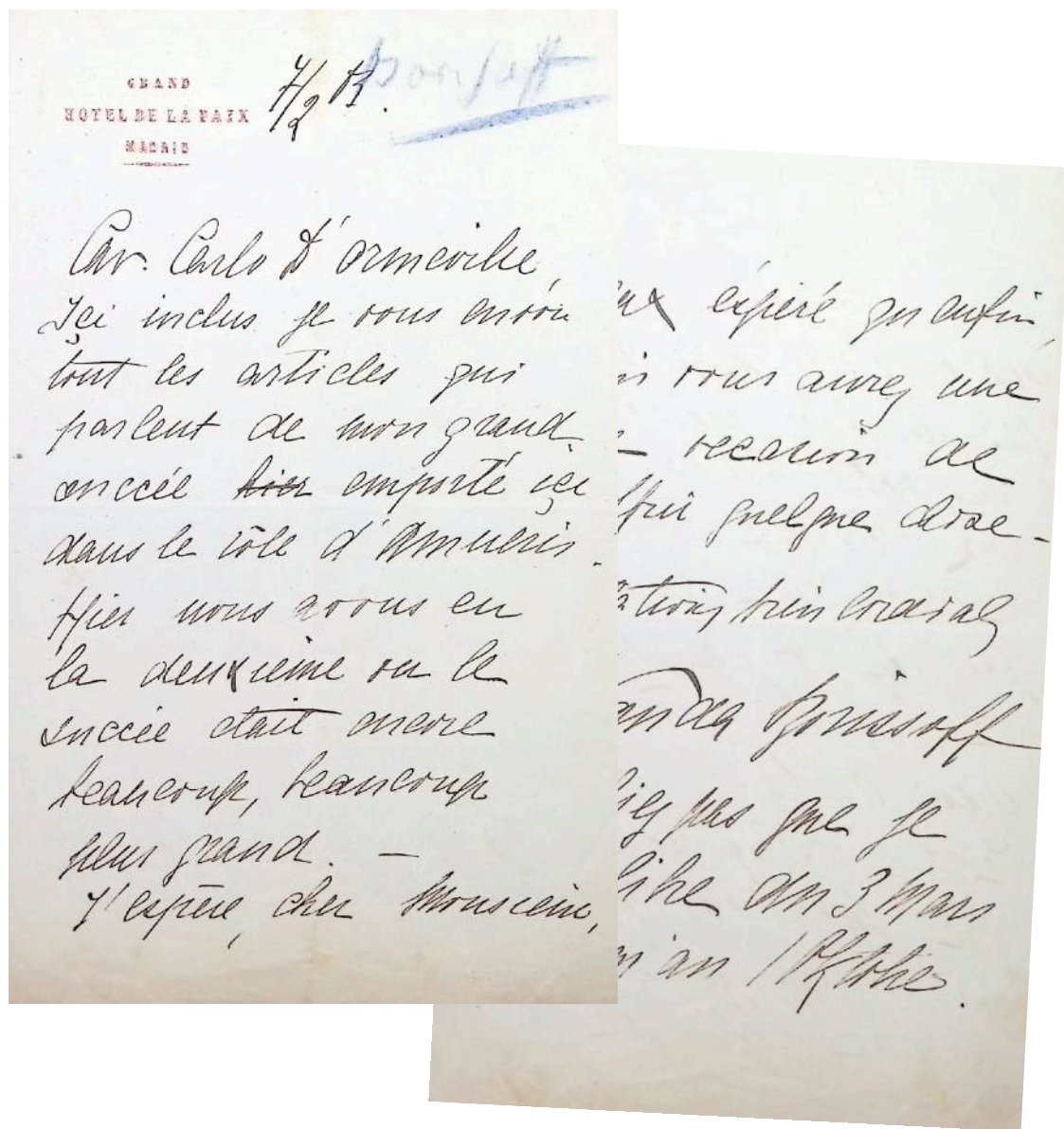


4. **Wanda Borisoff** (Russia 1870 ca.)

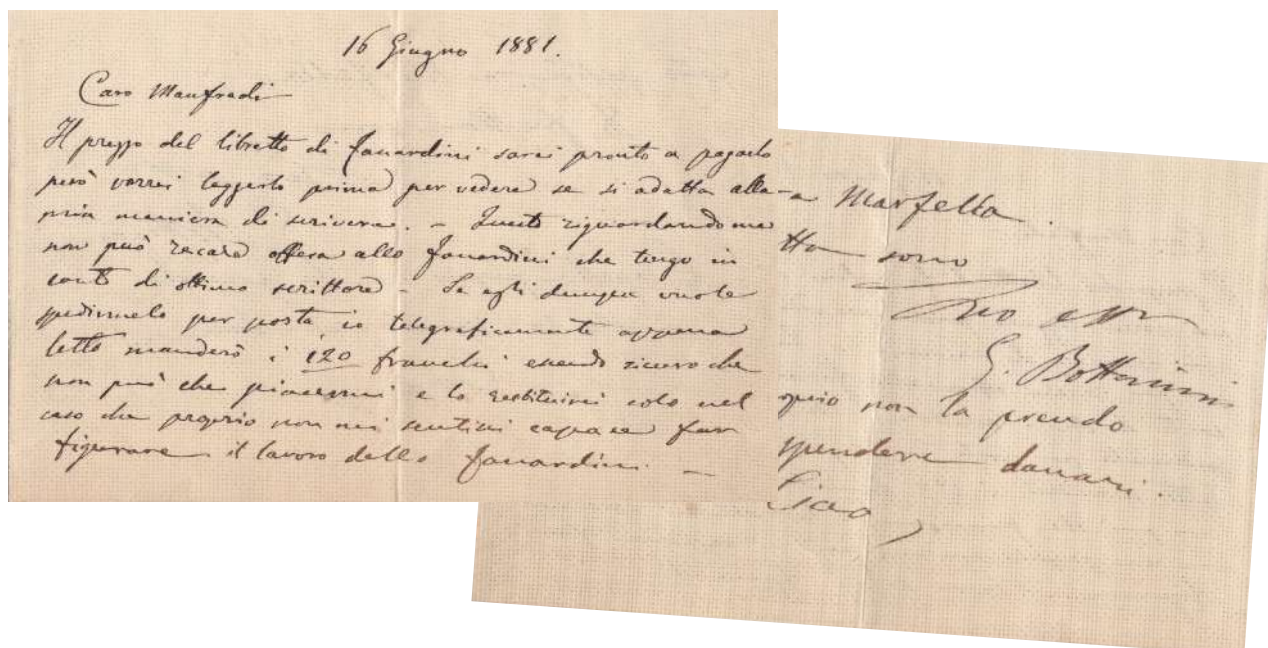

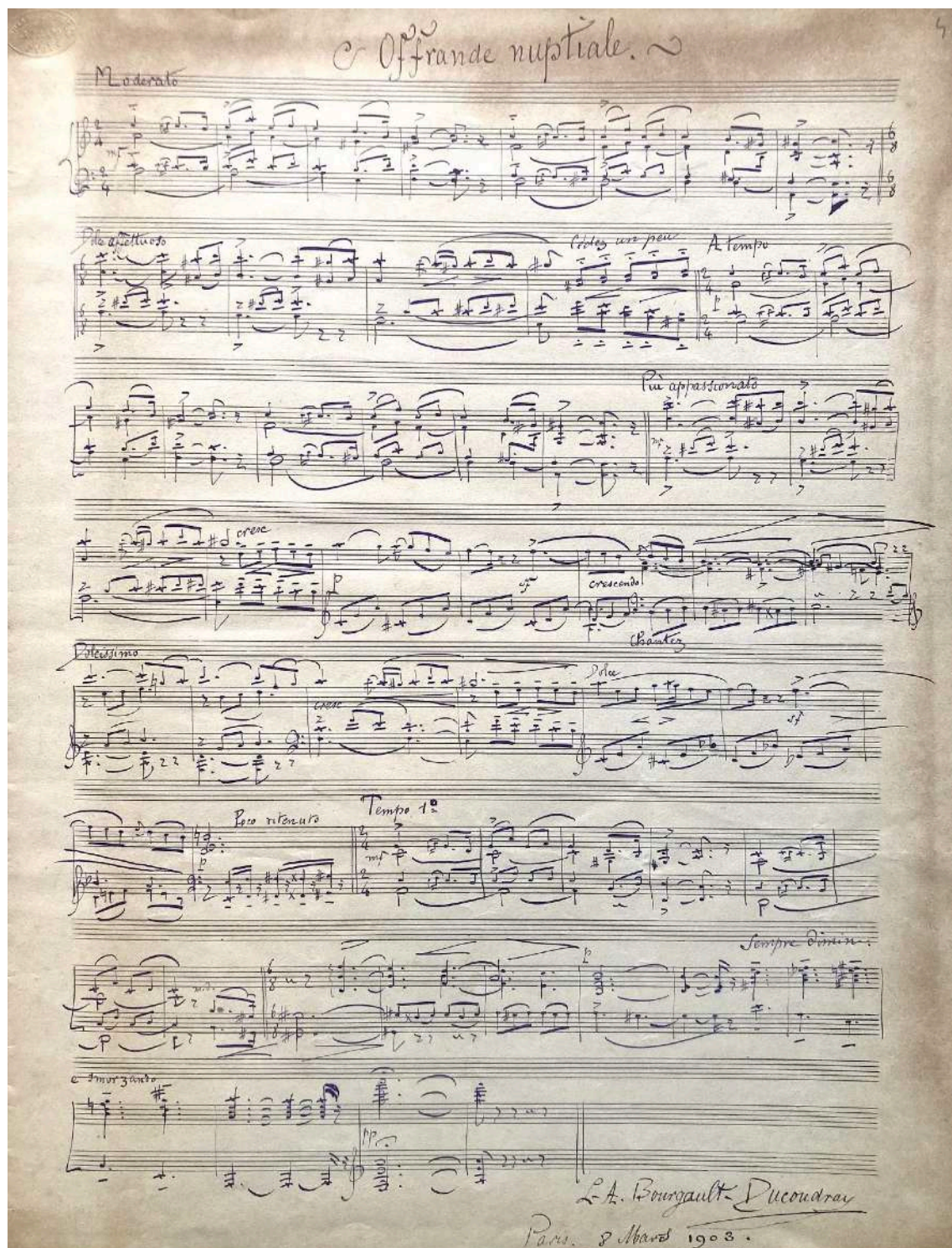
Fine autograph letter signed, dated "16 Giugno 1881" by the Italian double bass virtuoso, composer and conductor. Bottesini addresses Manfredi: "...Il prezzo del libretto di [Angelo] Zanardini sarei pronto a pagarlo però vorrei leggerlo prima per vedere se si adatta alla mia maniera di scrivere...". Zanardini did not write any librettos for Bottesini. However, this letter bears witness to a unknown collaborative project between the composer and the successful librettist. 2 pp. In-16. € 200



6. Louis-Albert Bourgault-Ducoudray (Nantes, 1840 - Vernouillet, 1910)

French piano music

Autograph music score titled "Offrande Nuptiale en la mineur pour piano", dated "Paris 8 Mars 1903" by the French composer and conductor. It is part of the "Album nuziale di Lorenzo Parodi" (1903). He thus anticipated 20th-century music, being one of those who provided Claude Debussy with the evocative archaism that through him became an essential element in modern musical style. 8. Nadina Bulicioff (Nizhny Novgorod, 1858 - Milan, 1921)

To Carlo d'Ormeville

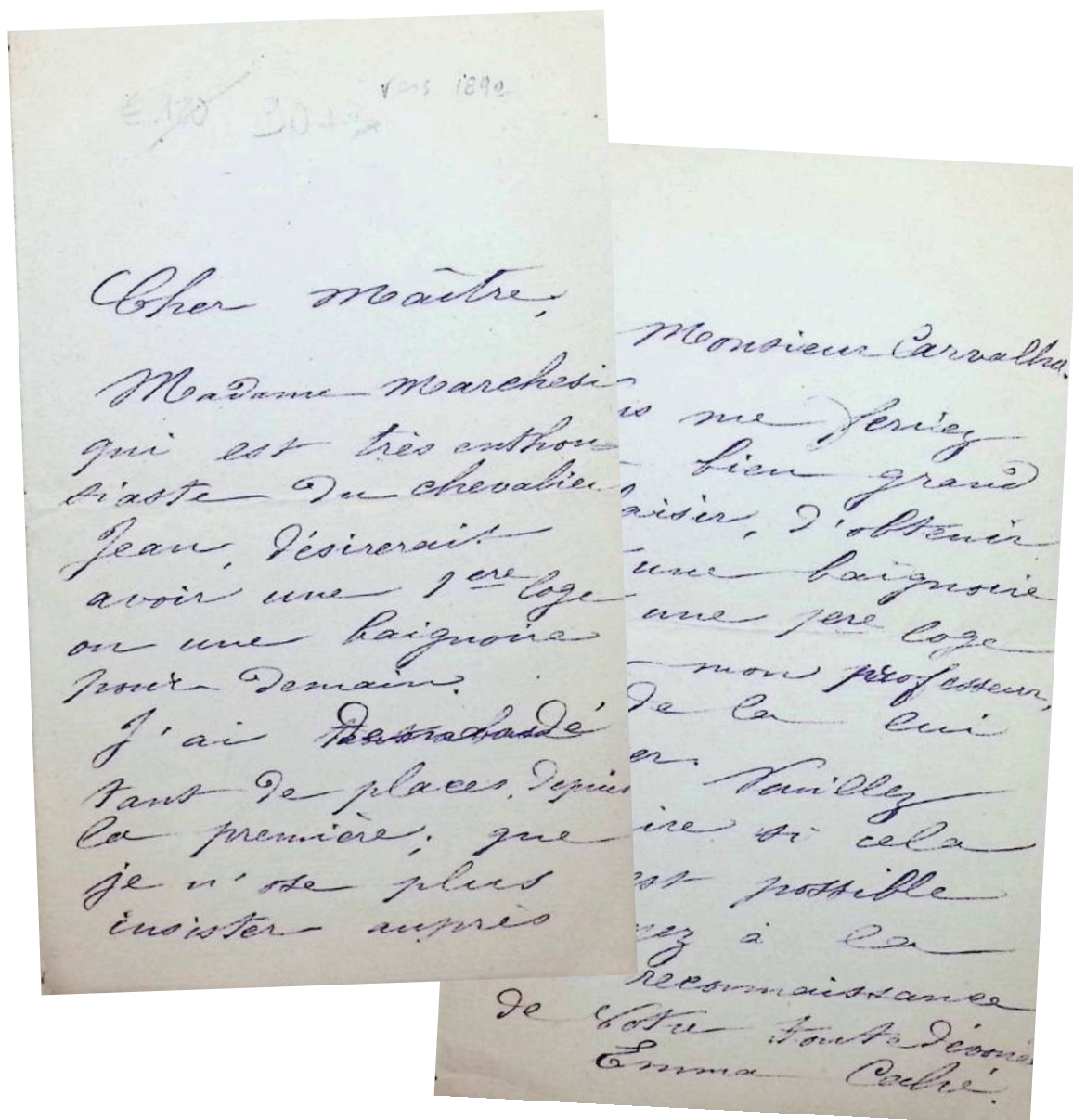
Autograph letter signed, dated "Firenze 1/10 85" by the Russian mezzo-soprano. She made her debut in 1880 playing the role of Rachel in the opera "La Juive" by Fromental Halévy at the Teatro Sociale in Mantova. The same year she appeared at the Teatro Regio in Turin, where she premiered the role of Ulla in the opera "Elda" by Alfredo Catalani on January 31, 1880, alongside the Polish singer Édouard de Reszke and the Italian tenor Enrico Barbacini. Addressed to the librettist Carlo d'Ormeville (1840 - 1924): "...Quantunque la mia domanda fosse molto modesta per una stagione tanto lunga e per le opere così grandiose, però Lei mi apprezza tanto per poco e mi offre nientemeno che la metà. Credo che la stagione al S. Carlo è di cinque mesi, poi dovrò cantare un'opera nuova, che chi sa se mi starà bene...". 4 pp. In-8. With embossed letterhead. In August 1886, Russian singer Nadina Bulicioff received a rapturous reception at the end of a concert she gave in Rio de Janeiro, when she publicly freed several enslaved women, hugging and kissing them on stage. € 120



9. Emma Calvé (Decazeville, 1858 - Millau, 1942)

Le chevalier Jean - Victorin Joncières

Autograph letter signed, not dated (but "1892") by the French dramatic soprano. She started learning music in Paris from Mathilde Marchesi and Manuel García. She made her operatic debut on 23 September 1881 in Gounod's "Faust" at Brussels La Monnaie. Later she sang at La Scala in Milan, and also at the principal theatres of Naples, Rome, and Florence. Among the various roles she played, in 1891 she created the part of Suzel in "L'amico Fritz" by Pietro Mascagni, playing and singing the role later at Rome. Because of her great success in it, she was chosen to appear as Santuzza in the French premiere of "Cavalleria rusticana", which was viewed as one of her greatest parts. To a "Maître"[Victorin Joncières]: "...Madame Marchesi qui est très enthousiaste du Chevalier Jean, désirerait avoir une 1^{re} loge ou une baignoire pour demain...". 2 pp. In-8. € 100



10. Marguerite Carré (Cabourg, 1880 - Paris, 1947)

The death of her husband Albert Carré

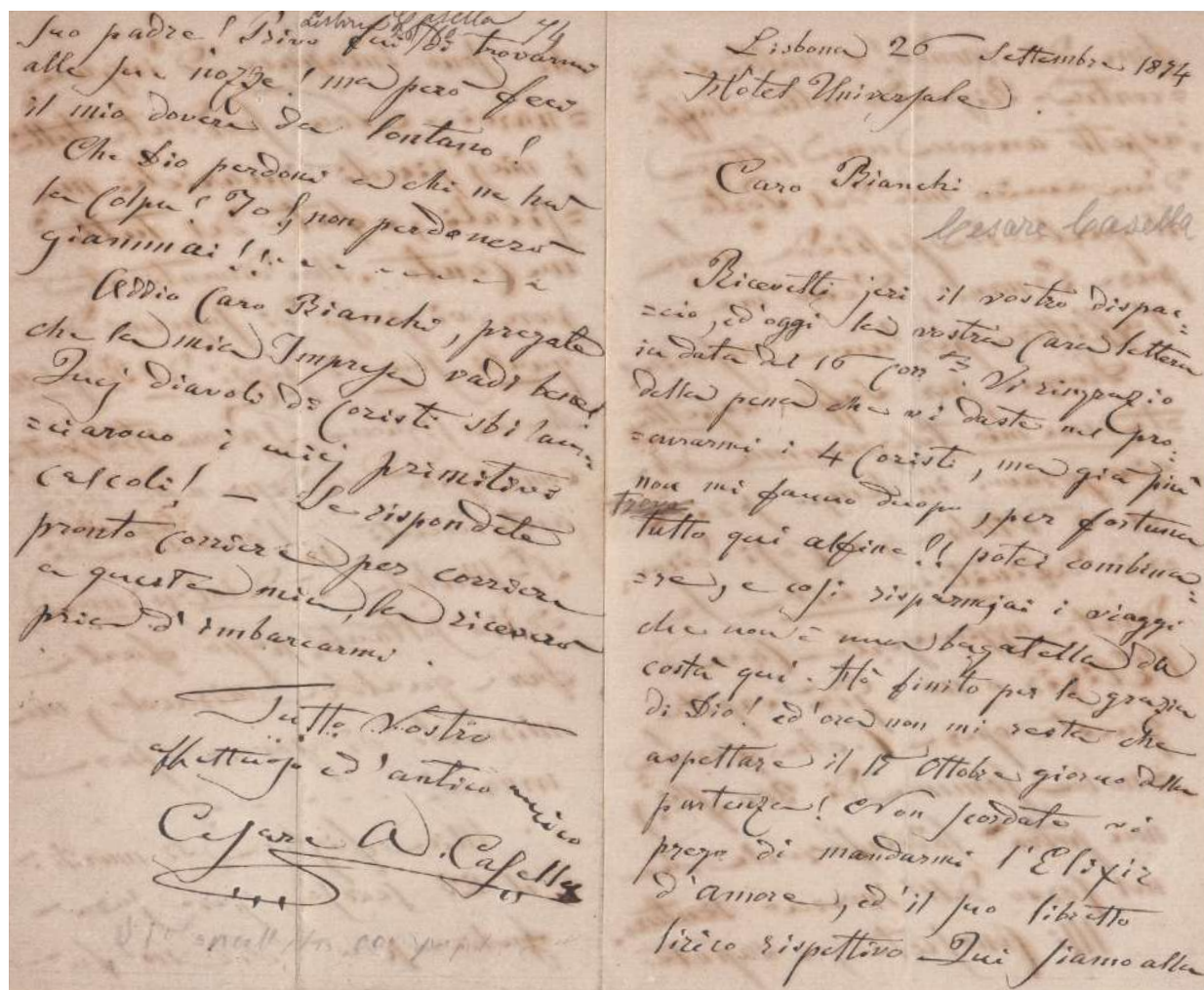
Autograph letter signed, postmarked "12.XII 1938" by the French soprano, who created numerous roles at the Paris Opéra-Comique. She was the first in Paris to perform Cio-Cio-San, the leading role in Puccini's *Madama Butterfly*. In addition, she earned acclaim for her work in the title role of Massenet's opera *Manon* and as Mélisande in *Pelléas and Mélisande*, the only opera by Debussy. To her friend Edouard Beaude, announcing the death of her husband the theater director Albert Carré (1852-1938): "...j'ai une nouvelle si triste à vous donner! 11. Cesare Augusto Casella (Lisbon, 1820 - 1884)

Cello music

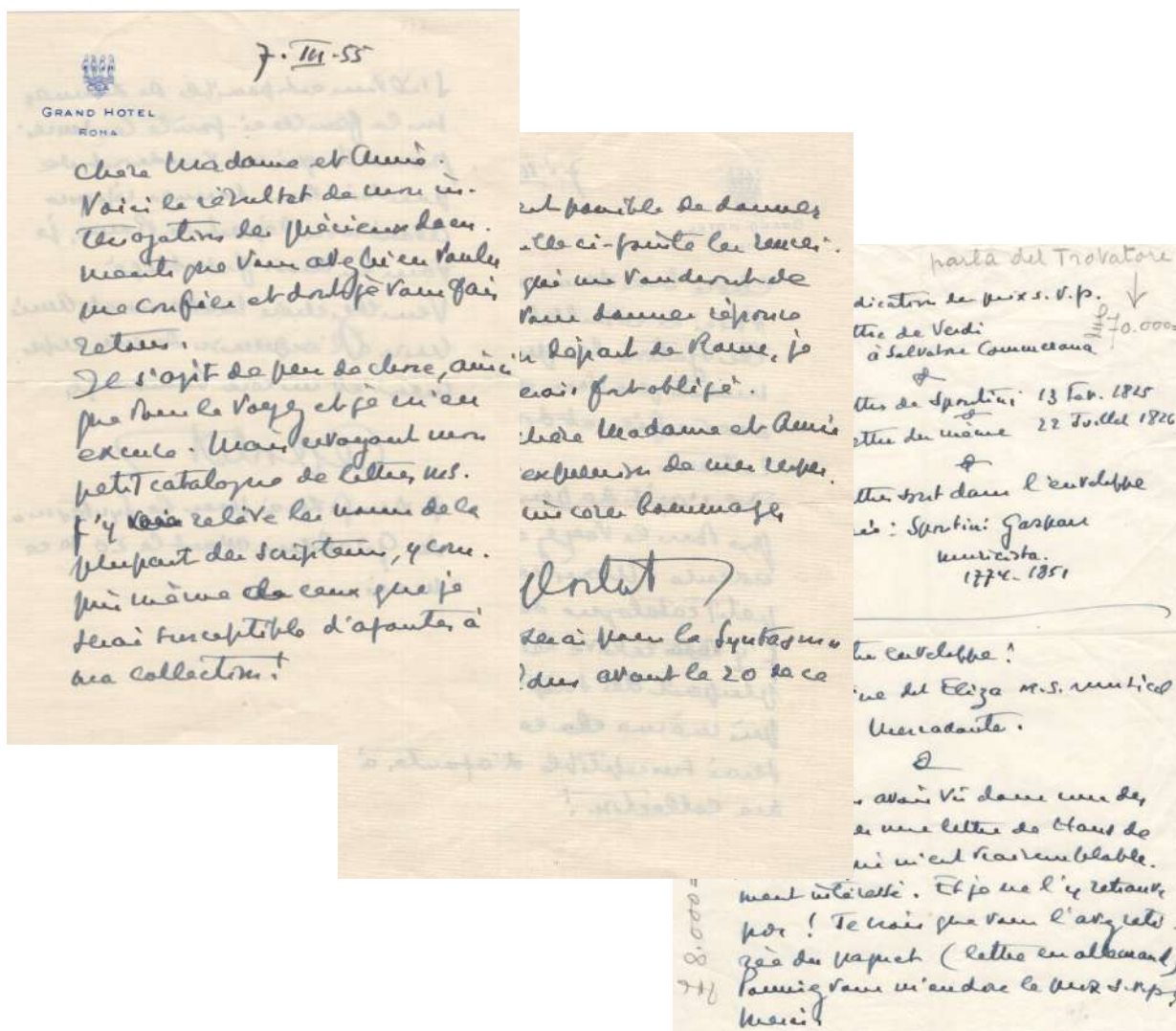
Rare autograph letter signed, dated "Lisbona 26 Settembre 1874" by the Italian cellist and conductor. He was the eldest son of Pietro Casella (1790 - 1858), founder of the Turin school of cello playing. To Mr. Bianchi: "...Non scordate vi prego di mandarmi l'Elixir d'Amore, ed il suo libretto lirico rispettivo (...) Non dimenticate pure vi prego di sapermi dire quali sono i pezzi del Rigoletto che la signora Pavoni trasporta (...) l'orchestra di St. Michele è debolissima, ed io soltanto ! posso farla fare qualche miracolo, ma miracoli di povero essere umano...". 4 pp. In-8. € 180



12. Alfred Cortot (Nyon, 1877 - Lausanne, 1962)

Autograph letter signed, dated "7. III. 55" by the French pianist and extraordinary connoisseur and collector of musical rarities. He was one of the founder of the Paris École normale de musique. Addressed to the antique bookseller Clara Querzola: "...voici le résultat de mon interrogation des précieux documents que vous avez bien voulu me confier et dont je vous fais retour...". In a separate sheet, Cortot lists 3 autographs he sends to Querzola: "...1. lettre de Verdi à Salvatore Cammarano et 2. Lettre de Spontini (...) 3. Lettre du même...". 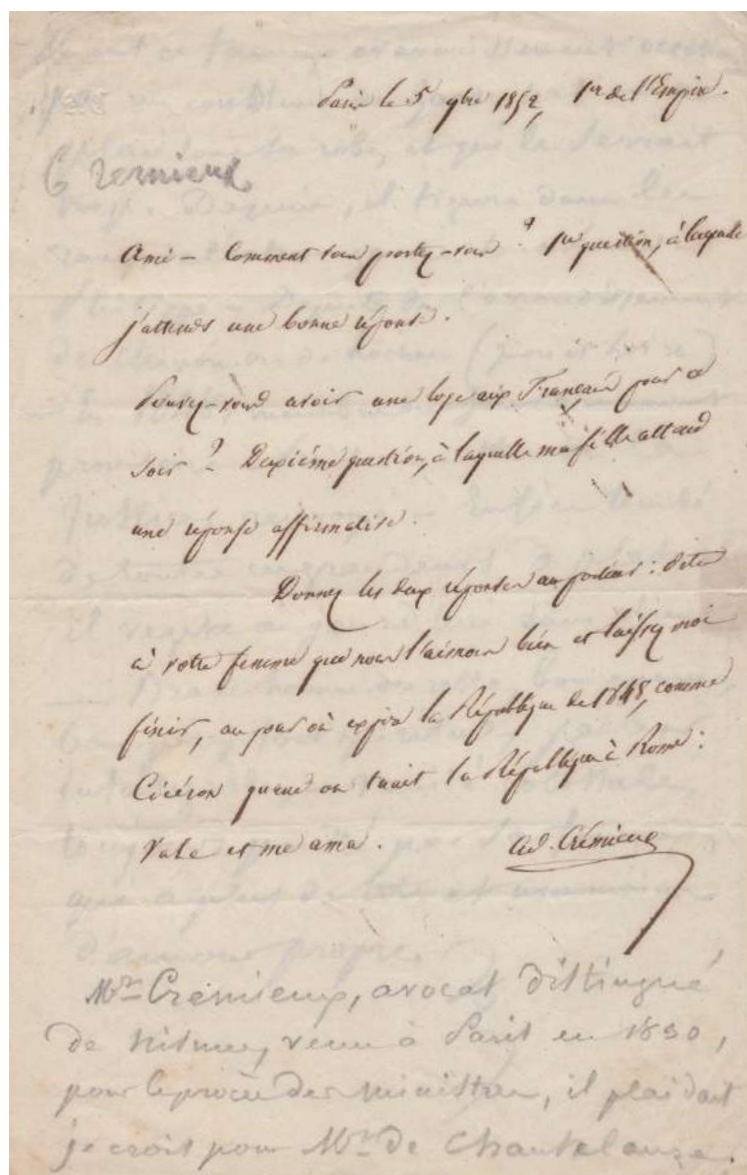


13. Adolphe Crémieux (Nîmes, 1796, Paris, 1880)

Autograph letter signed, dated "Paris le 5 9bre 1852, 1er de l'Empire" by the French lawyer and politician who served as Minister of Justice under the Second Republic. To a friend: "...Pouvez-vous avoir une loge aux [théâtre] Français pour ce soir ? ...". At the bottom and on the third page, biographical notes signed in French concerning Crémieux. 1 p. In-4.

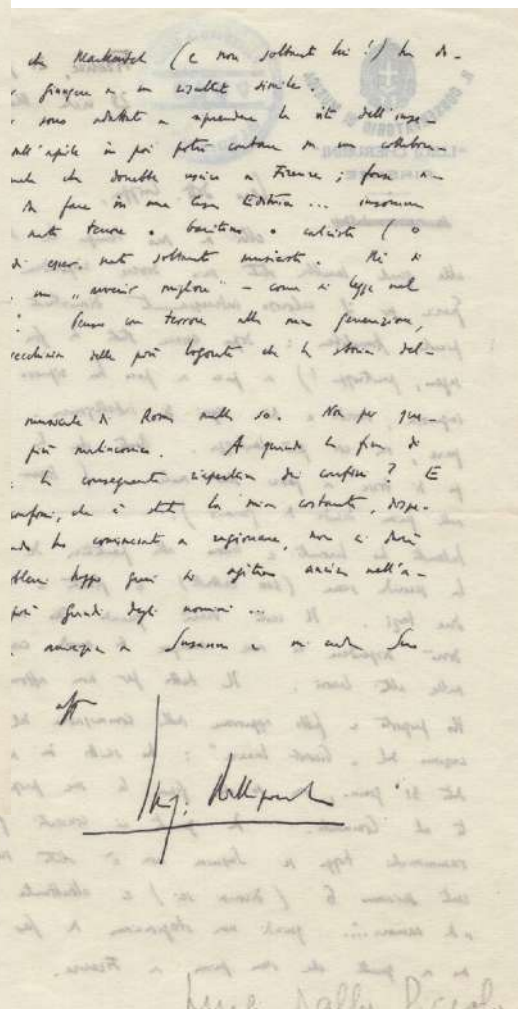
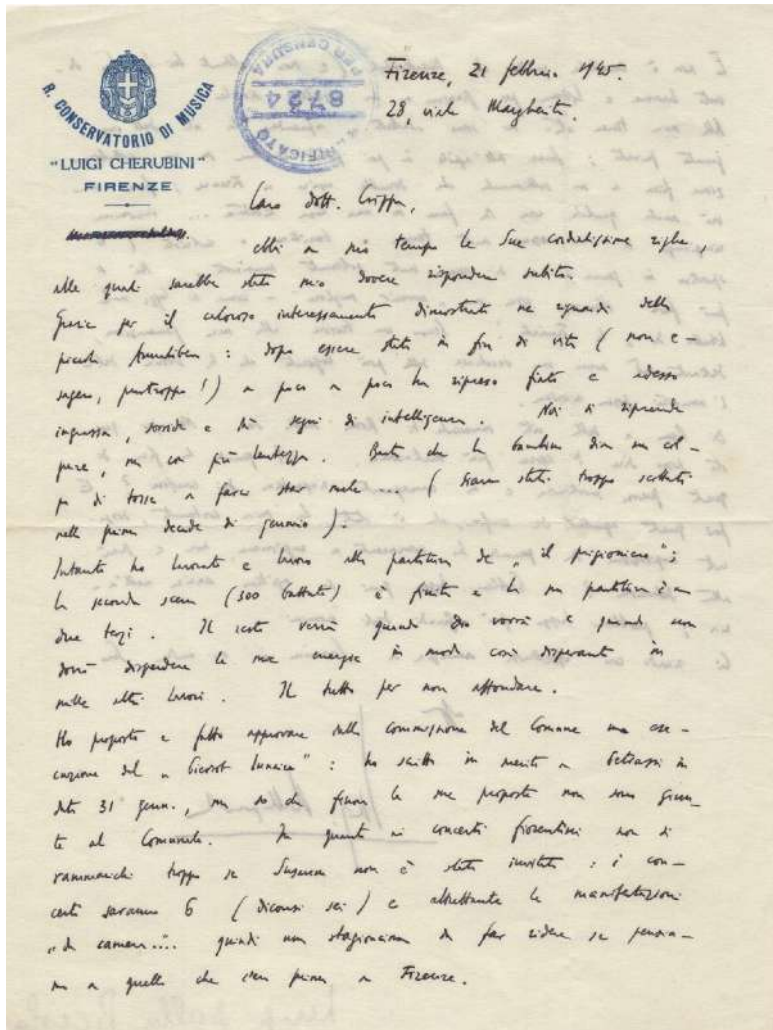

Il prigioniero

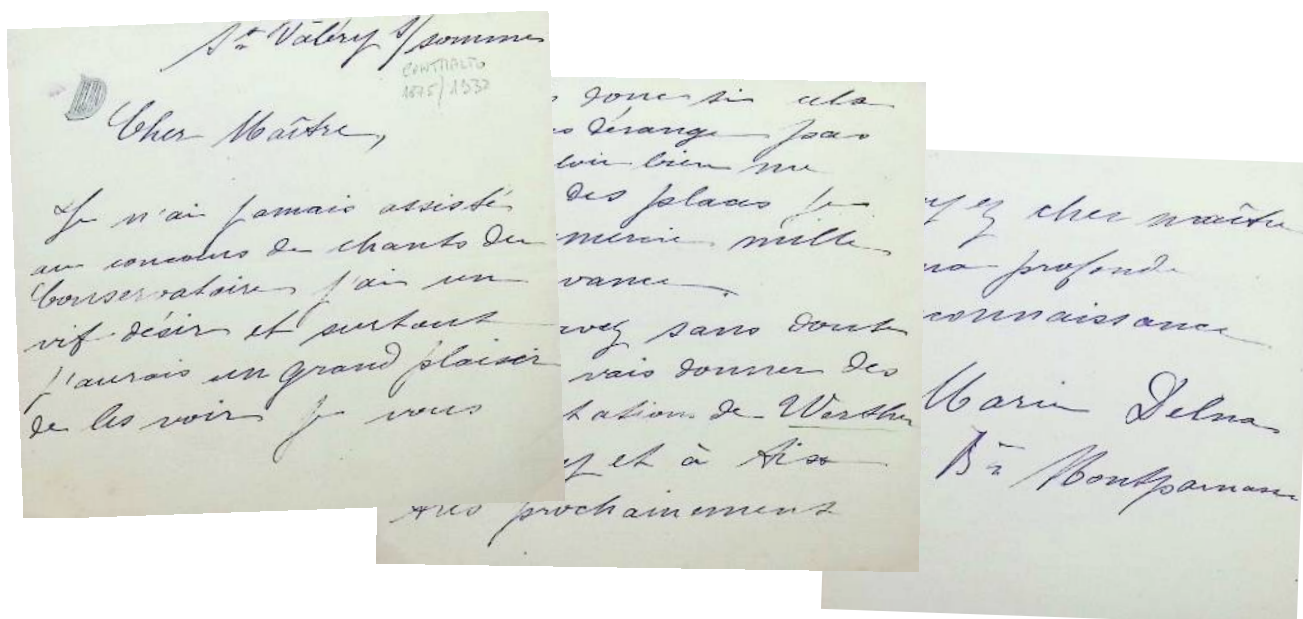
Beautiful autograph letter signed, dated "Firenze, 21 febr. 1945" by the celebrated Italian composer. Addressed to Renato Crippa, it is written shortly after the end of the war (bearing the military censor's stamp), it documents the musical renaissance of the post-war period: "...ho lavorato e buono alla partitura de "Il prigioniero"; la seconda scena (300 battute è finita e la mia partitura è a due terzi. Il resto verrà quando dio vorrà (...)) Ho proposto e fatto approvare dalla commissione del Comune una esecuzione del "Pierrot lunaire": ho scritto in merito a Petrassi in data 31 genn. (...) in quanto ai concerti fiorentini non si rammarichi troppo se Susanna non è stata invitata: i concerti saranno 6 (diconsi sei) e altrettante le manifestazioni "da camera" quindi una stagione da far ridere se pensiamo a quello che c'era prima a Firenze...". 2 pp. In-4. 15. Marie Delna (Paris, 1875 - ib., 1932)

"Je n'ai jamais assisté au concours de chants du Conservatoire..."

Autograph letter signed, not dated by the French contralto. Born Marie Ledant she was spotted by Léon Carvalho, director of Opéra-Comique, who suggested her stage name. In June 1892, she made a sensational stage debut, just after her 17th birthday, as Didon in "Les Troyens à Carthage". She created many roles such as Marceline in Bruneau's L'attaque du moulin, Mistress Quickly in the first French "Falstaff", supervised by Verdi, Ginèvre in Victorin de Joncières's "Lancelot" and many others. Addressed to a "Maître": "...Je n'ai jamais assisté au concours de chants du Conservatoire. J'ai un vif désir et surtout j'aurais un grand plaisir de les voir...". 2 pp. On cardboard. (12 x 11 cm). 16. Jakob Dont (Vienna 1815 - Ib. 1888)

Defilier 'Fest' Marsch

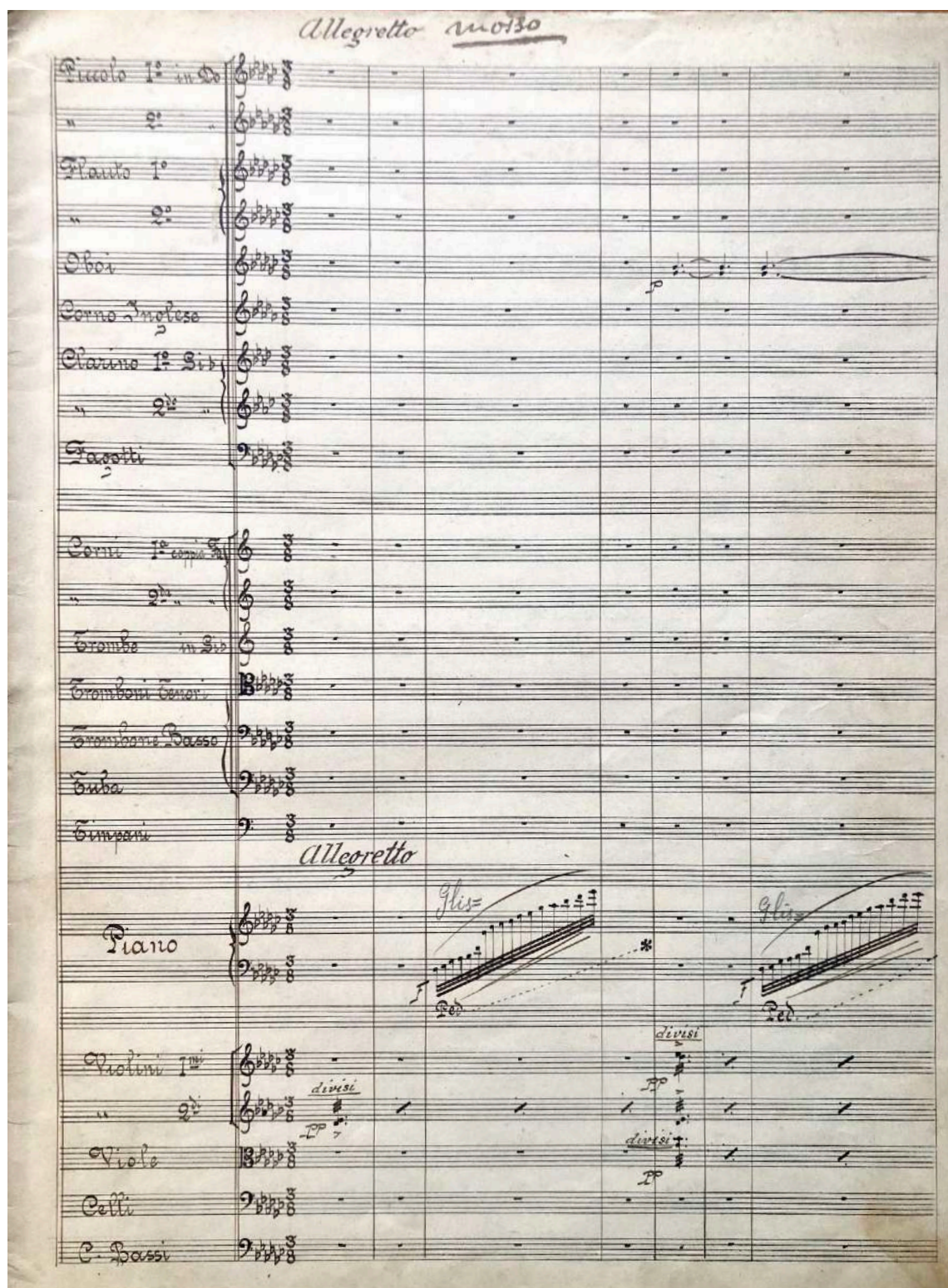
Autograph music score for piano titled "Defilier 'Fest' Marsch" by the Austrian violinist and composer. Dont was a well-known teacher. His father Valentin Dont was a very successful cellist. His son Jacob was a student of Böhm (who was also the teacher of Joachim) and of Hellmesberger senior at the Vienna Conservatory and in 1831, at the age of 16, became a member of the Hofburgtheater Orchestra. Later, in 1834, he entered the services of the Imperial Court Orchestra, also in Vienna. Dont taught first at the Pädagogium at St. Anna and from 1873 at the Conservatory in Vienna. 17. Eduardo Félix Fabini (Solís de Matajo 1882 - 1950)

La Isla de los Ceibos

Manuscript score with autograph corrections titled "La Isla de los Ceibos/Poema sinfonico" by the Uruguayan composer and musician. 37 pp. Campo, his first symphonic poem, which was first performed in public at the Teatro Albéniz in Montevideo on 1922. Campo obtained immediately widespread recognition of his musical values, being also enshrined Buenos Aires - where he was performed in 1925 at the Teatro Colón by the Vienna Philharmonic - and soon in New York, Washington, Madrid, Barcelona, Berlin, Moscow, Valencia, Rio de Janeiro and other major music cities such as Vienna, where was performed by the Vienna Philharmonic conducted by Richard Strauss. Encouraged by this success, Fabini continued intense activity in the composition of works that evoke the sounds and atmospheres of the Uruguayan countryside; presenting soon after his other symphonic poems, including The Island of ceibos. Among his works are numerous songs, school choirs, and fantasy for violin and orchestra. In 1927, he was appointed Artistic Added at the Embassy of Uruguay in the US, can move to the city of New York where Field and The Island of Ceibos were recorded by the Philharmonic Orchestra. 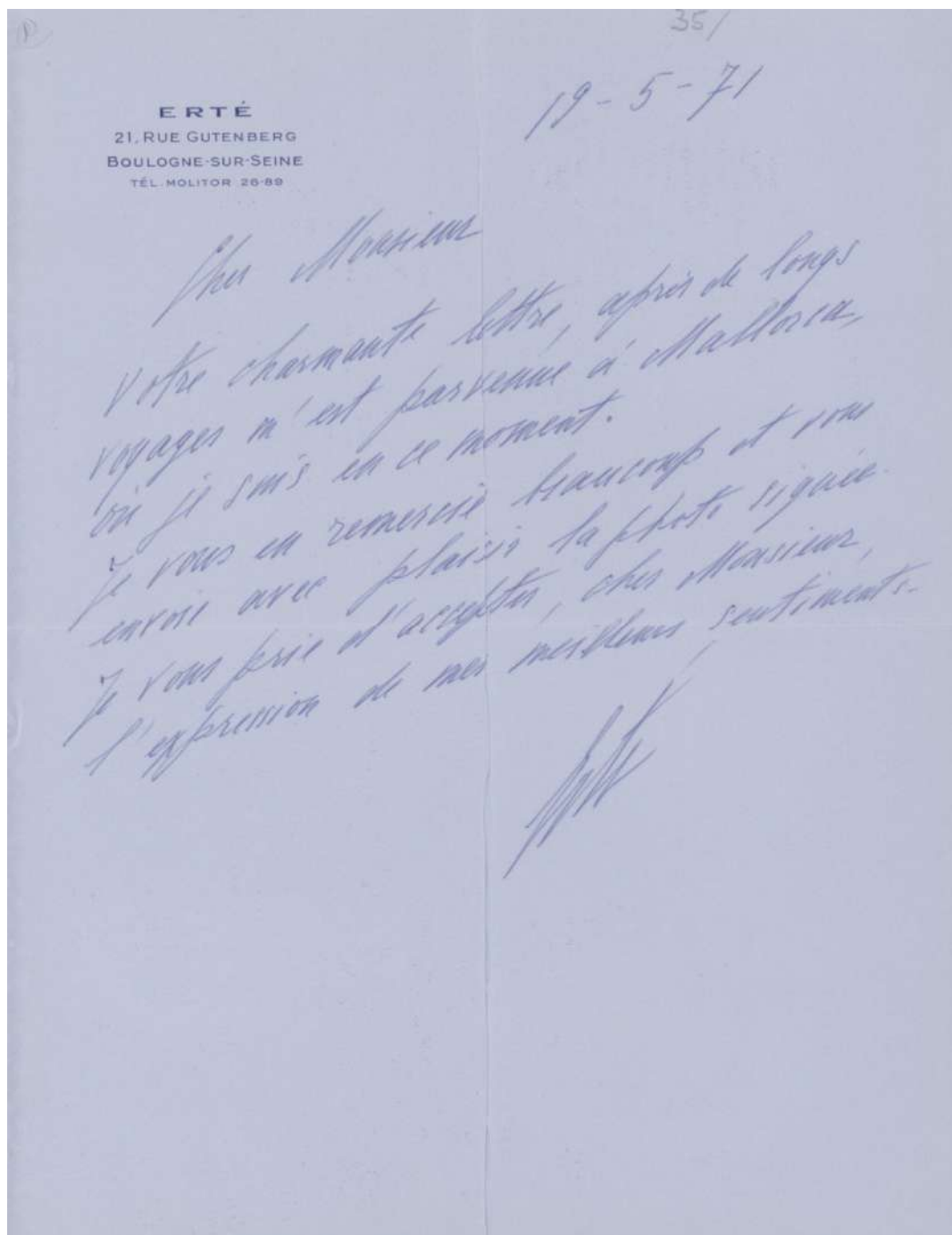


18. Erté - Romain de Tiroff (Saint-Petersburg, 1892 - Paris, 1990)

Autograph letter signed, dated "19-5-71", by the Russian-born French artist and designer. He has produced works in a variety of fields such as fashion, graphic arts, set designs for films, opera. Erté addresses a gentleman, thanking him for his letter: "...après de longs voyages m'est parvenue à Mallorca, où je suis en ce moment. 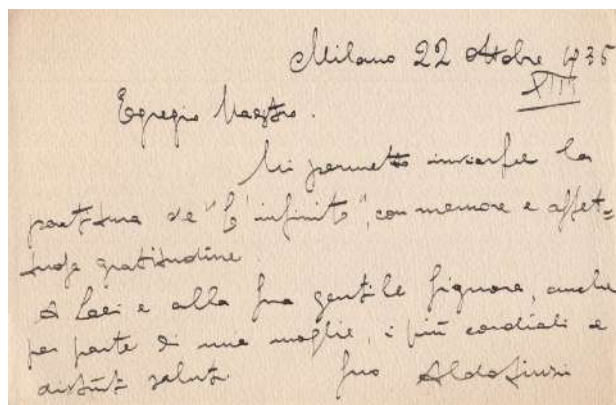


19. Aldo Finzi (Milan, 1897 - Turin, 1945)

L'infinito

Autograph letter signed, dated "Milano 22 ottobre 1935 XIII" by the Italian composer. Addressed to a Maestro: "...Mi permetto inviarle la partitura de "L'infinito", con memore e affettuosa gratitudine...". Born in Milan into an old Jewish family that originally came from Mantua. The family had a traditional love for music and Finzi's aunt was a celebrated soprano. In 1937 the Scala Theatre announced a competition for a new opera to be performed during the following season. Aldo Finzi decided to enter the competition with his work "La Serenata al Vento". In spite of having unofficially won the competition and being recognized as a considerable musical talent, the unfortunate timing of the onset of World-War II and Finzi's early death in 1945 undoubtedly contributes to the fact that the work and profile of Aldo Finzi remains unknown outside Italy. 1 p. 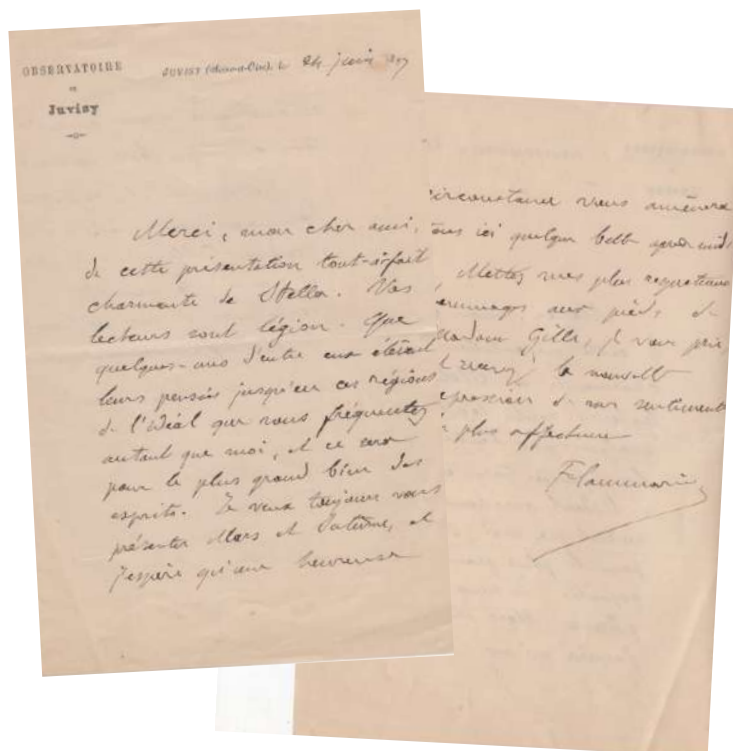

20. Camille Flammarion (Montigny-le-Roi, 1842 - Juvisy-sur-Orge, 1925)

Alberto Maso Gilli

Autograph letter signed, dated "Juvisy...le 24 juin 1897" by the French astronomer and author, who wrote science works about astronomy, as well as several notable early science fiction novels and works on psychical research and related topics. Addressed to a Alberto Maso Gilli: "...Que quelques-uns d'entre eux élevait leur pensées jusqu'en ces régions de l'idéal que vous fréquentés autant que moi, il ce sera pour le plus grand bien des esprits. 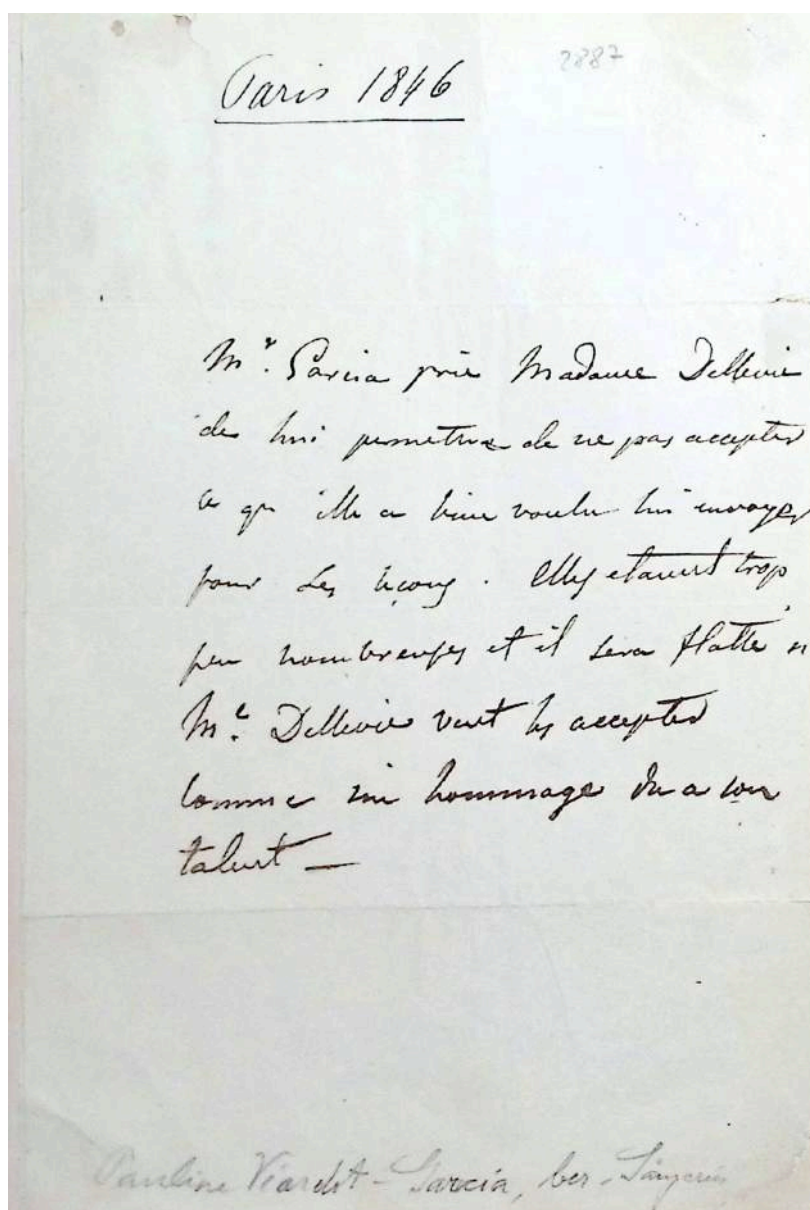

21. Manuel Garcia (Madrid 1805 - London 1906)

Sophie Leo

Fine autograph letter signed, dated "Paris 1846" by the French baritone, teacher and composer. His father was singer and teacher Manuel del Pópulo Vicente Rodríguez García. His sisters were Maria Malibran and Pauline Viardot. After abandoning his onstage career as a baritone, García began to teach at the Paris Conservatory and the Royal Academy of Music, London. Jessie Bond, Camille Everardi, Erminia Frezzolini, Julius Günther, Jenny Lind, Mathilde Marchesi, Christina Nilsson, Julia Ettie Crane, Georgina Schubert, Julius Stockhausen, Marie Tempest, Charles Santley and Henry Wood were among his pupils: "Mr. Garcia prie Madame Dellevie de lui permettre de ne pas accepter ce qui elle a bien voulu lui envoyer pour les leçons. Elles étant trop peu nombreuse et il sera flatte si Mme Dellevie veut les accepter comme son hommage du a son talent". "Mr Garcia asks Mrs Dellevie to allow him to decline what she has kindly sent him for his lessons. There are too few of them, and he would be flattered if Mrs Dellevie would accept them as a tribute to his talent". Sophie Augustine Dellevie (1796–1864), daughter of Salomon Eliezer Dellevie (1758–1810) and Franziska Schnabel (1758–1850), born in Hamburg, married the Jewish banker Auguste Leo (1793–1859) in 1824 at the Temple des Billettes. The couple led an intense cultural life in the capital, frequenting writers, painters and musicians (Heine, Chopin, Viardot, Garcia, Weber, Liszt, etc 1 p. In-8. € 240



22. Mary Garden (Aberdeen, 1874 - Inverurie, 1967)

At the Hotel Pierre in New York

Autograph letter signed, dated "Sept 23 30" by the Scottish-American soprano, with a substantial career in France and America in the first third of the 20th century. Described as the Sarah Bernhardt of opera, Garden was an exceptional actress as well as a talented singer. In 1907, Oscar Hammerstein convinced Garden to join the Manhattan Opera House in New York where she became an immediate success. By 1910 she was a household name in America and Garden appeared in operas in several major American cities including performing with the Boston Opera Company and the Philadelphia Opera Company. Between 1910 and 1932 Garden worked in several opera houses in Chicago. She created a sensation as Salomé in the French version of Richard Strauss's opera of that name. Addressed to Sybil Lambton: "...I regret I have any photos to offer you now, but I'll be back in the U.S.A. in November... at the Hotel Pierre in New York." 2 pp. In-8.

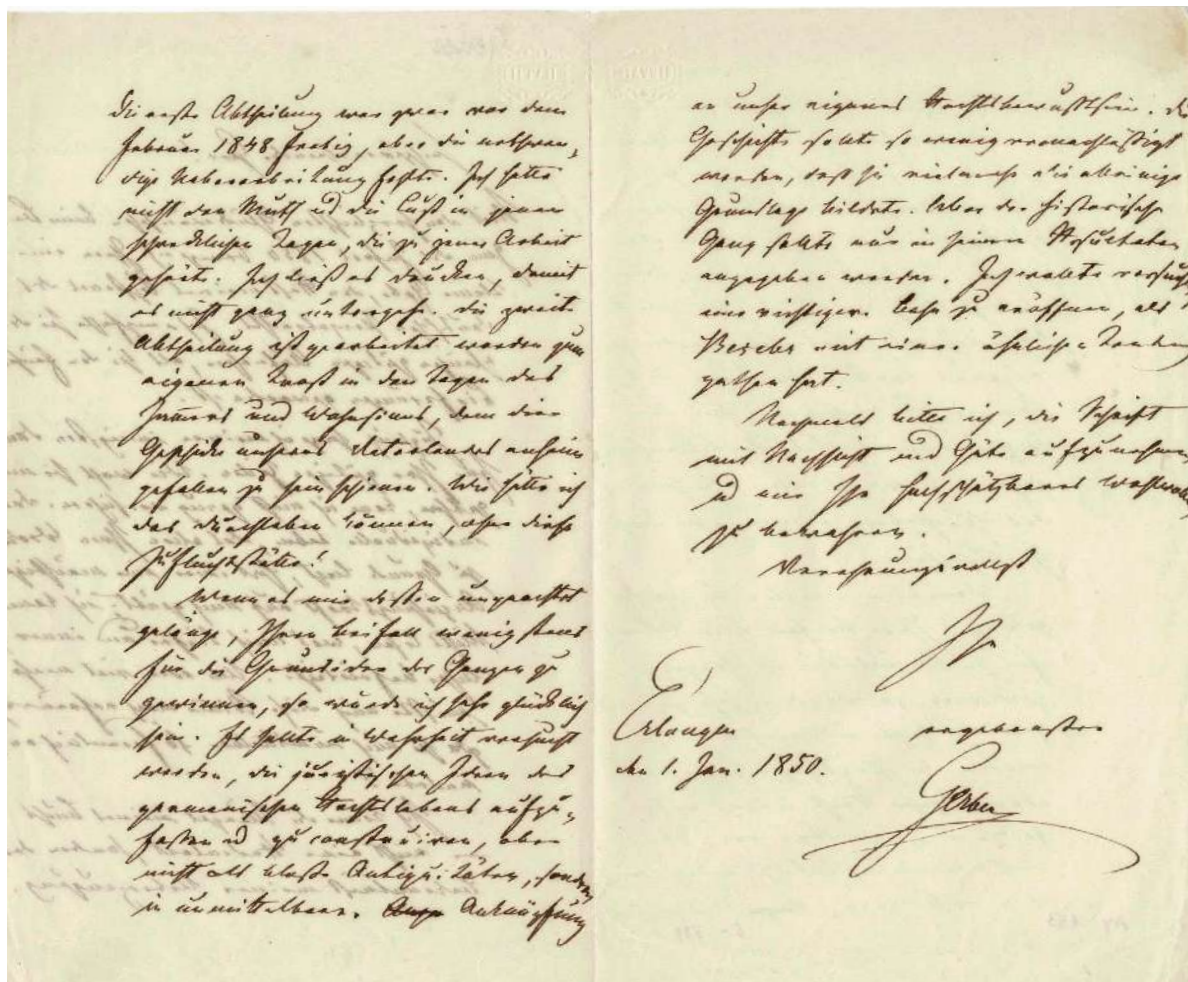

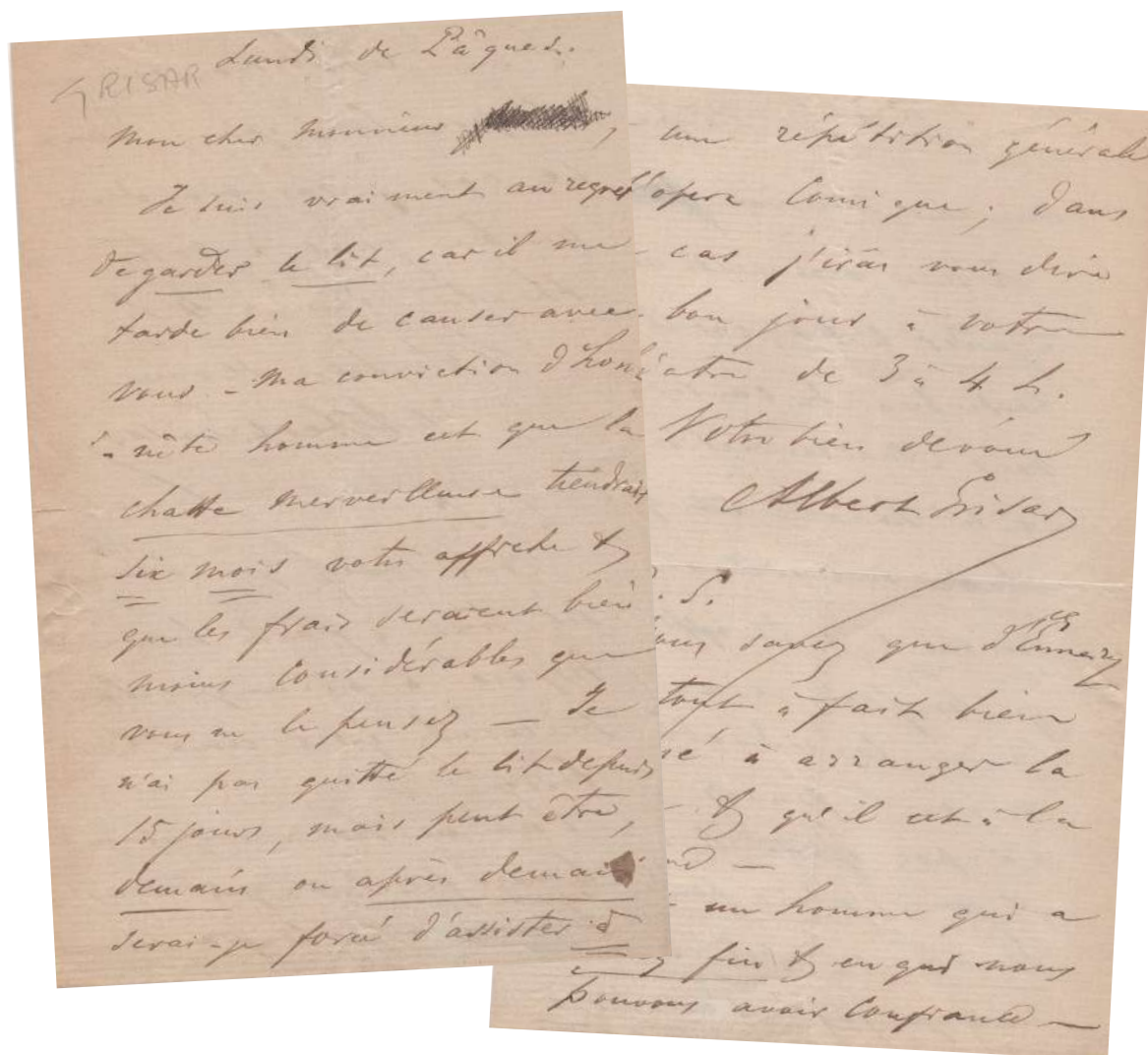

He will be professor at the university of Erlangen, Staatsminister and Ministry of Culture. "...History should be neglected so little that it even forms the sole basis, but the historical whole should only be given in its results. 24. **Albert Grisar** (Anvers, 1808 - Asnières-sur-Seine, 1869)

Fine autograph letter signed, dated "Lundi de Pâques" by the Belgian composer. To a gentleman: "... Ma conviction d'honnête homme est que la chatte merveilleuse tiendrait six mois votre approche et que les frais seraient bien moins considérables que vous ne le pensez. Je n'ai pas quitté le lit depuis 15 jours, mais peut-être, demain ou après demain serais-je forcé d'assister à une répétition générale à l'opéra Comique; dans ce cas j'irai vous dire un bon jour à votre théâtre (...) 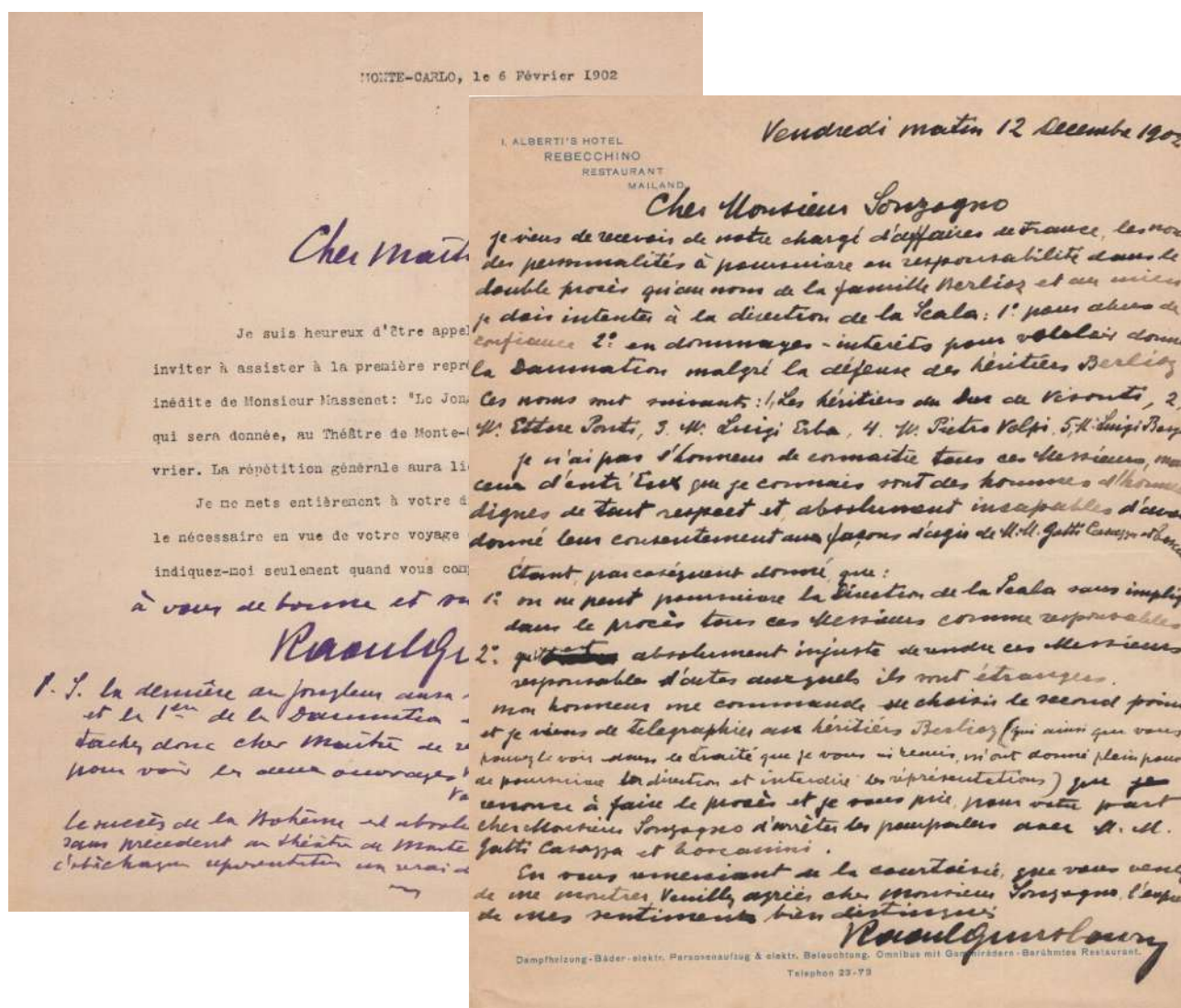

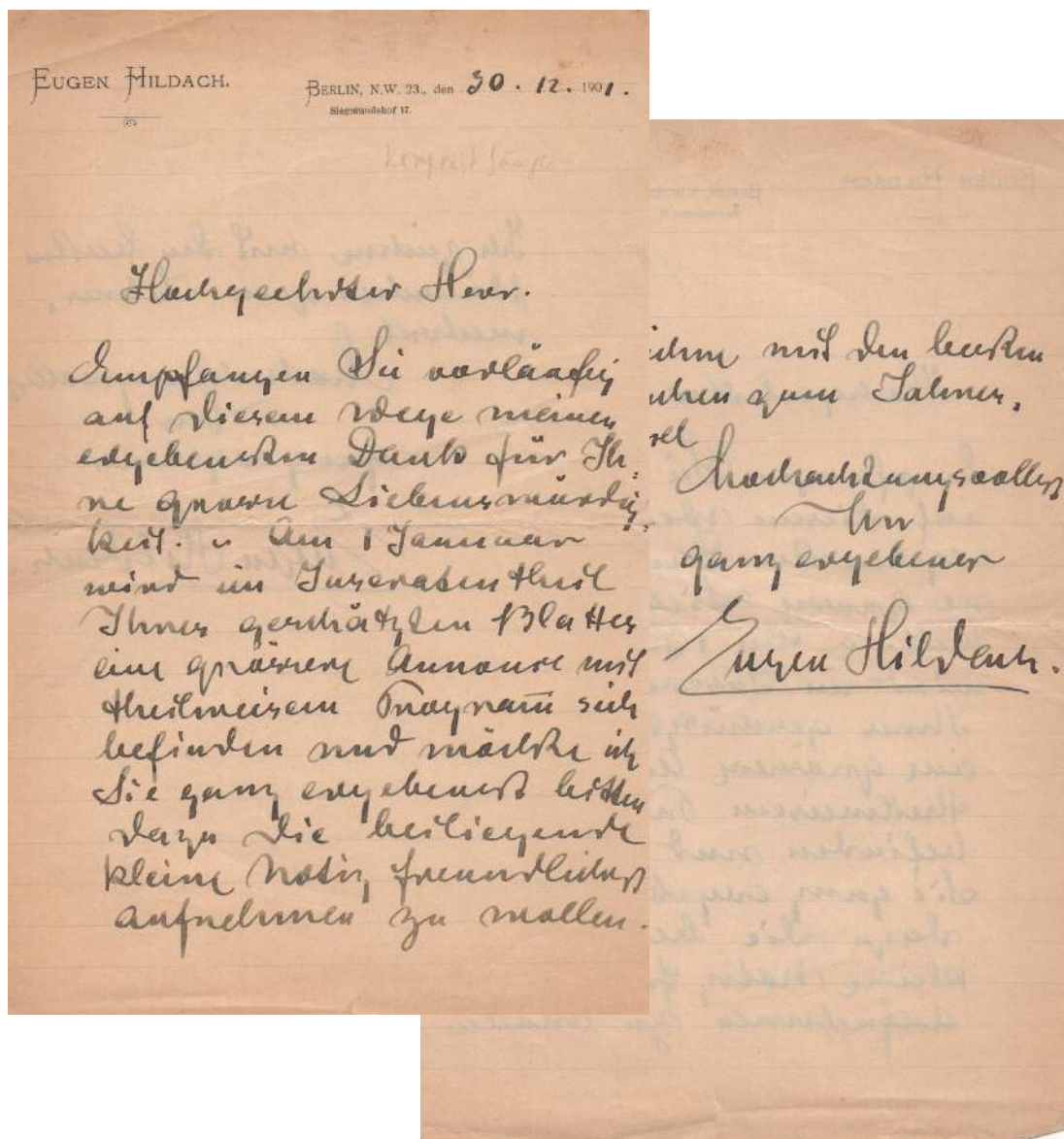

Autograph letter signed, dated "Berlin, den 30. 12. 1901" by the German baritone and composer. In German. To a gentleman, concerning a publication. After having studied the building trades, he turned to singing (barytone) and studied with the famous Frau Dreyschock in Berlin. In 1878 he married another singing student of hers, Anna Schubert (mezzosopran), and together they taught singing at the university of Dresden. 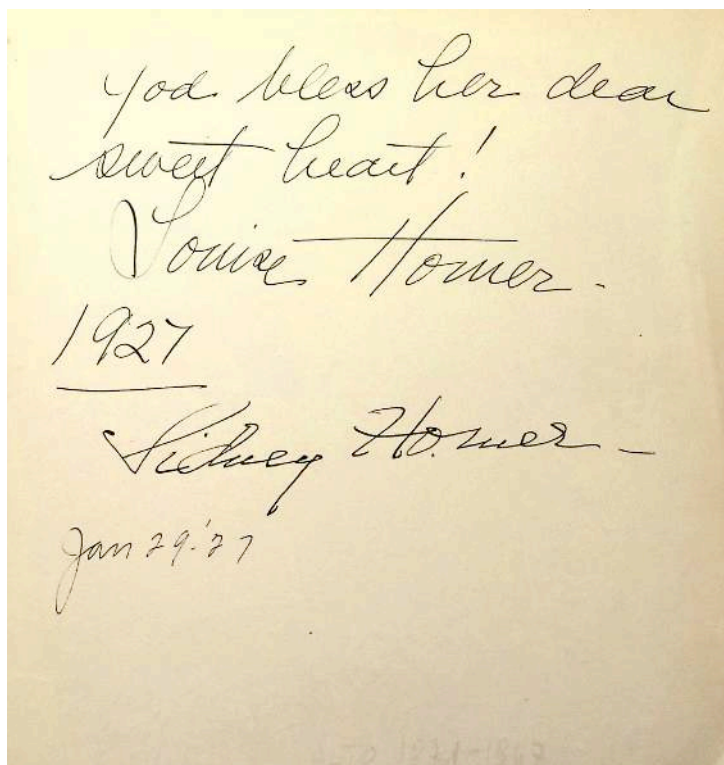


27. Sidney Homer (1864 - 1953) and Louise Homer (1871 - 1947)

Autograph dedication signed dated "1927" by the American dramatic contralto, countersigned by her husband the classical composer, who in turn dates "Jan 29 - 27". Sidney and Louise had six children, including twin daughters Anne Homer and Kathryn Homer, son Sidney Homer, Jr. (economist and author), and daughter Louise Homer. 1 p. (16 x 18 cm).

28. Engelbert Humperdinck (Siegburg, 1854 - Neustrelitz, 1921)

Printed visiting card of the German composer, widely known for his opera "Hansel and Gretel" (1893). He began taking music classes under Ferdinand Hiller and Isidor Seiss at the Cologne Conservatory in 1872. In 1876, he won a scholarship that enabled him to go to Munich, where he studied with Franz Lachner and later with Josef Rheinberger. In 1879, he won the first Mendelssohn Award given by the Mendelssohn Stiftung in Berlin. 1 p. In-32.

29. Giuseppe Kaschmann (Lussinpiccolo, 1850 - Rome, 1925)

Massenet's Cantate biblique

Lot of four autograph letters signed by the Austrian-Italian baritone. His first public performance occurred in Zagreb during 1869. Six years later he made his Italian operatic debut at Turin (in Gaetano Donizetti's *La favorita*). He reached the peak of his success as a singer in the 1880s and 1890s, building an international reputation (as Giuseppe Kaschmann) and performing at such important venues as the Bayreuth Festspielhaus in Germany (in 1892 and 1894) and the Metropolitan Opera in New York City (in 1883 and 1896), as well as continuing to appear at La Scala. All letters are addressed to the Italian marquise Angiolina Toscanelli Altoviti Avila (1859–d.) in Italian and relate to musical affairs, such as scheduled concerts organised by the Marquise in Florence. One beautiful photograph and an envelope with autograph address are included.

A. "Venezia 31 Marzo 1899". 44. Vasily Safonov (Ishcherskaya, 1852 - Kislovodsk, 1918)

He also taught the theorist and pedagogue Maria Levinskaya as well as Marthe Servine, a French-American composer and pianist. After retiring from teaching, Safonov achieved recognition as a conductor. He conducted the first Moscow performance of Tchaikovsky's Pathétique Symphony (No. 6) on 4/16 December 1893, seven weeks after its premiere under the composer's direction and six weeks after his death. Safonov conducted many of Europe's leading orchestras, including the Berlin Philharmonic, Vienna Philharmonic, Prague Philharmonic, the Lamoureux Orchestra of Paris, the London Symphony Orchestra and the New York Philharmonic. He is regarded as the first modern conductor known to have dispensed with the use of the baton. According to reports, this practice began when he once forgot to bring his baton to a rehearsal and conducted with his hands; he subsequently considered the baton unnecessary. This second part of her career was even more brilliant than the first. She revived some of her old rôles, but began to abandon the *jeunes premières* for the "lead" in which she had a big success. Her later triumphs were especially associated with new plays by Émile Augier, *Le Fils de Giboyer* and *Maître Guerin*.
