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

Photographic portrait with autograph musical quotation and dedication signed dated *Wien 1924* by the Hungarian mezzo-soprano, who debuted at the Grand Musikverein in Vienna in 1911 with the support of Franz Schalk and Richard Strauss. Rosette Anday was, moreover, one of the most popular and most frequently engaged altos in the oratorio and Lieder sphere. Her dedication to the music of Gustav Mahler - at that time by no means fully accepted as a composer - is proved by her participations in "Das Lied von der Erde", which she sang at a festival matinee at the Vienna State Opera in 1923 as well as in the first performance of the same work in Paris and in London. 1 p. 






























