

1. Ignacio Manuel Altamirano (Guerrero, 1834 - Sanremo, 1893)

Cabinet-card photographic portrait with autograph dedication signed (on the verso), dated *Mexico Noviembre 26 1876* of the Mexican writer, journalist and politician. He wrote the novel "Clemencia", which is considered one of the first modern Mexican novel. Photograph by Cruces Y Campa in Mexico City. Defects and humidity spots at margins.




2. Anton Georg Apponyi (Oponice, 1751 - Wien 1817)

Biblioteca Apponiana



Autograph letter signed, dated *am 9 October 1811* by the count of Oponice. Apponyi library in Oponice was born thanks to unaffected love for book. It was established in Vienna by patron and count of Oponice Anton Grorg Apponyi. He had loved books and collected them for all his life. Apponyi collected during his life more than 30.000 precious books - for comparison today there is only half of them in library, about 15.000... The library had more than 400 incunabula at the end of the 18th century! Very precious was work of „Prudentii Aureli Opera“ written on parchment from the 9th century, Dante's „Allighieri commedia col commento“ with engravings of Sandro Botticelli or famous Bible from Johannes Gutenberg from 1435 that are nowadays considered to be the absolute gems of European librarianship... That was the library in the glory of its period. When the founder Anton Georg Apponyi died in 1817, the library was in danger of downfall for the first time. From his 9 children only count Anton Apponyi (1782-1852) – patron and diplomat, was interested in saving the library. Finally, he saved the library and transferred it from Vienna to Bratislava. The opening ceremony took place in 1827 and at request of count Apponyi it became the first public library in Slovakia. In London, from where it used to receive precious English press, it was known as „Public National Library of Presbourg“. The library was operating in Bratislava for 19 years, it is a paradox that then the town refused to support it financially and Apponyi transferred it from Bratislava to Oponice to Renaissance manor house where it was supposed to stay forever. 
3. Francisco de Asís, Duke of Cádiz (Aranjuez, 1822 - Épinay-sur-Seine, 1902)

Two letters signed (cachet signatures), dated *31 de Enero 1853* and *31 de Enero de 1866* King consort of Spain, spouse of Queen Isabella II (1833-1868), father of Alfonso XII (1874-1885). 4. Pierre-Joseph van Beneden (Mechelen, 1809 - Leuven, 1894)


Autograph letter signed, dated *Louvain d. 23 Mars 1859* by the Belgian zoologist and paleontologist. Pupil of Georges Cuvier, he was curator at the natural history museum in Leuven and professor of Zoology at the Catholic University of Leuven (1836-1849). Van Beneden addresses to the zoologist and anthropologist Jean Louis Armand de Quatrefages de Bréau (1810-1892), concerning a missed meeting and the sending of some of his works. 2 pp. In-8. 5. Otto von Böthlingk (Saint Petersburg, 1815 - Leipzig, 1904)


Autograph letter signed, dated Jena, den 6ten November 1872 by the Russian-German Indologist and Sanskrit scholar, author of a Sanskrit-German dictionary (1855-1875, Saint Petersburg) with the assistance of Rudolf Roth and Albrecht Weber and a treaty on Vedic accent ("Über den Accent im Sanskrit" (1843)). Böthlingk addresses Angelo De Gubernatis, concerning his book "Cenni sopra alcuni Indianisti viventi": "...meinem besten dann sage für die manichsachen Zusendungen, die ich von Ihnen erhielt, und für die freundlichen Worte, mit desem Sie meiner in Ihren Cenni sopra alcuni Indianisti viventi gedenken (...). Die zwei ersten Bände meiner spunkte werden Sie hoffentlich richtig erhalten haben. Von 3te Bande 28 1/2 Bogen gedruckt. Die zwei ersten Lieferungen vom 7ter teile sind erschienen, oder wo es scheint, noch nicht in Leipzig angekommen.". Translation: "In saying then my best to you for the many things that I received from you and for the kind words with which you remember me in your Cenni sopra alcuni Indianisti viventi (...). The first two volumes of my points you will hopefully have received correctly. From 3te volume 28 1/2 sheets printed. 6. August Emil Braun (Gotha, 1809 - Rome, 1856)


Two partly printed documents with autograph signature, dated 1836 by the German archaeologist, fellow of Eduard Gerhards, he was secretary to the German Archaeologist Institute. In the first document, Braun addresses a letter to the archaeologist Guarini (1756-1852), apologizing for not having answered to his letter for a long time. In the second document, he signs a laissez-passer for the foreign member, the architect Christoph Riggenbach, who visits the Istituto di Corrispondenza Archeologica for study purposes. 7. August Emil Braun (Gotha, 1809 - Rome, 1856)


Autograph letter signed, dated 13 Debr 1841 by the German archaeologist, fellow of Eduard Gerhards, he was secretary to the German Archaeologist Institute. Braun addresses the mosaic artist Michelangelo Barberi (1789-1867), concerning some mosaics for the Emperor of Russia Nicholas I: "...Avendo inteso che Sua Maestà l'Imperadore di tutte le Russie stia per fare de' preparativi per lavori grandiosi in musaico ad ornare i magnifici tempi cristiani da Esso Lui innalzati in gloria d'Iddio, devo supporre che possa riuscir importante un'opera da me preparata intorno i musaici delle Basiliche romane che hanno conservato appunto lo stile liturgico della chiesa greca. Le tramando qualche prova delle tavole colorite le quali Ella forse potrebbe porre sotto gli sguardi di Sua Maestà.


8. Pedro II of Brazil (Rio de Janeiro, 1825 - Paris, 1891)

Letter signed, dated no Palacio do Rio de Janeiro *em 3 de Novembro 1869* second and last monarch of the Empire of Brazil (1831-1889), he was the seventh child of Dom Pedro I of Brazil and Empress Dona Maria Leopoldina. His political and social work for Brazil moved toward the abolition of slavery. Addressed to Cardinal Ugolini, sending back Christmas wishes. 1 p. In-4. With royal seal. € 240




9. René Dardel (Lyon, 1796 - Condrieu, 1871)

Autograph letter signed, dated *Lyon le 27bre 1861* by the French architect of the city of Lyon from 1830 to 1851. Dardel addresses to the writer Joséph Marie Soulary: "...par suite d'exigence architectural j'ai été obligé d'ôter un peu de paillir à la table qui portais vos charmantes voeux: par le fait les voeux ont été enlevé, provisoirement, avant de les rétablir...". 1 p. 
10. Jean-Baptiste-Denis Després (Dijon, 1752 - Paris, 1832)

11. Jules Destrée (Marcinelle, 1863 - Brussels, 1936)

Autograph letter signed on postcard, dated 1924 by the Walloon lawyer and socialist politician, part of the Belgian Labour Party. He signed in 1929 together with Camille Huysmans the "Compromis des Belges" who accepted the cultural autonomy of Flanders and Wallonia and suggested greater autonomy for provinces and municipalities. On the verso of the postcard depicting the decoration of the Maison du Peuple of Trazegnies, Destrée inscribes: "*L'effort d'art des ouvriers de Hainaut...*". 1 p. 50





13. Denis Frayssinous (Curières, 1765 - Saint-Geniez-d'Olt, 1841)

Autograph letter signed, dated *ce dimanche matin*, 27 Fevrier by the French bishop, statesman and writer, he was member of the Académie Française and almoner of Louis XVIII. Frayssinous sends an invitation to attend a sermon in the presence of the king and crown prince in the royal chapel. 1 p. In-8.





Gaspary addresses a colleague, concerning Italian early poetry: “...Hier send ich Ihnen, was ich and den Presieen der 5. Bandes der Antiche Rime bessern konnte. 

17. Franz Anton von Hallweil (Pressburg, 1702 - Wien 1779)


Autograph letter signed, dated 15 de Xbre 1748 by the Habsburg general and war councilor, captain from 1738 in the dragoon regiment of Prince Eugene of Savoy and lieutenant colonel. Hallweil addresses a gentleman: "...Je vous serait sans doute connu, que le régiment est en marche faisant pour l'Hongrie, comme quoi donc en passant Pulsano, j'ai trouvé une réponse du Colonel Marquis de Ficogna au sujet de Mr de votre fils, et comme il est écrit un peu mal français, pour vous témoigner mon amitié, j'ai copié l'article, que regarde celui en question. 18. Joseph von Hammer-Purgstall (Graz, 1774 - Vienna, 1856)


Autograph letter signed, dated *Vienna 9 Novembre 1845* by the Austrian diplomat and Orientalist, he published numerous translations of Arabic, Persian and Turkish authors, such as the first complete translations of Hafez's divan in a Western language. He came into friendly conflict with the British Orientalist Edward William Lane (1801-1876) on the subject of the origin of "The Thousand and One Nights". Hammer-Purgstall supported the foundation of the Academy of Sciences of Vienna and was its first president (1847-1849). Hammer-Purgstall addresses Mr. Signa: "...Anche afflittissimo della malitia temuta ... del mio figlio carissimo Massimiliano nella compagnia alla quale ho fatto l'anno passato il viaggio di Milano, e non avendo altra oggetto di audiienza ne ho domandata una oggi a S. E. Conte di Kolowrat [Franz Anton] (...) subito mi son accorto che la confondeva con un altro suo concittadino (...) mi ha promesso di incaricarsi del .. rapporto domandato al V... l'inverno passato; e di segundar l'affare...". 3 pp. In-8. € 350



19. Wilhelm Henzen (Bremen, 1816 - Rome, 1887)


Letter signed, dated *Roma li 7 Luglio 1874* by the German philologist and Latin epigraphist, who carried out plans for a universal "Corpus Inscriptionum Latinarum" along with Theodor Mommsen (1817-1903) and Giovanni Battista de Rossi (1822-1894). Henzen addresses a colleague: "...il latore di questa è il Dottore Eugenio Bormann [1842-1917, epigraphist and philologist], il quale si reca in Firenze onde raccogliere notizie epigrafiche pel nostro *Corpus inscriptionum latinarum*, di cui egli è egregio collaboratore. 
20. Carl Gustav Jacob Jacobi (Potsdam, 1804 - Berlin, 1851)


21. Ferdinand Justi (Marburg, 1837 - ib., 1907)

Autograph letter signed, dated Marburg 26/1 79 by the German linguist and Orientalist, he published works of Kurdish and old Persian grammar in German. Justi addresses a gentleman: "...Anbei folgen die beiden noch austehenden Biio – und Bibliographien der beiden Marburger Celebritäten Roser un Heppe; letztrter wünscht auch ein Exemplar des Werkes zu besitzen; auch die hierige Universitätsbibliothek hat subscribst. Ich ergreife diese gelegenheit, um im Titel meines Kurdischen Lexicons (woher in der bibliographie angeübsst ist): obwohl das Dictionnaire Kurde-Français noch nicht srchienen ist, hat die Akademie zu Petersburg doch 1878 auf den Titel gesetzt, weil meine ten Vorrede aus dem Dezember 1878 stammst. Dennächst beginnt der Drucke meiner Kurdisten Grammatik. ..." Translation: "Enclosed are the two still outstanding biographies and bibliographies of the two Marburg celebrities Roser and Heppe; the latter also wishes to possess a copy of the work; the university library here also has subscribst. I take this opportunity to mention in the title of my Kurdish Lexicon (from where it is mentioned in the bibliography): although the Dictionnaire Kurde-Français is not yet published, the Academy of Petersburg has put 1878 on the title, because my preface dates from December 1878. 
30. John Murray IV (London 1851 - Ib. 1928)

Murray addresses Eric Pinker about the publication of the book Places in the Sun by the statesman, future Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, Anthony Eden (1897-1977): "...I am glad to say that after some negotiation and delay, we have been able to arrange with the Conservative Office to take 1,000 copies at a low rate for propaganda purposes. 31. Jules-Ernest Naville (Chancy, 1816 - Genève, 1909)


Very interesting autograph letter signed, dated *Vernier, 8 Décembre 1891* by the Swiss theologist and philosopher, author of several works on protestant morality, he was one of the first developers of proportional representation. Naville addresses "Ma chère Marie", concerning the hospital of Geneva: "...Il y a Genève une Maternité officielle annexe de l'hôpital public, qui doit être maintenant en voie de transformation. En effet, il a été constaté que le service de l'hôpital était si mal fait ici que, malgré une opposition si vive, on vient de décider l'appel de diaconesses pour remplir les infirmeries ordinaires qui lassaient trop à désirer. Ce qui rendait la mesure délicate, c'est que l'appel des diaconesses rendra bien difficile de refuser la demande de laisser rentrer les sceau de la charité qui ont été expulsées du pays, à la honte de Genève. Quelques dames bienfaisantes ont organisé, sous le nom de la Misericordie une maison où l'on reçoit les filles-mères, mais à une première faute seulement, pour tâcher d'exercer sur elles une influence moralement salutaire. C'est une petite société fort modeste et qui n'a pas de statuts. 


